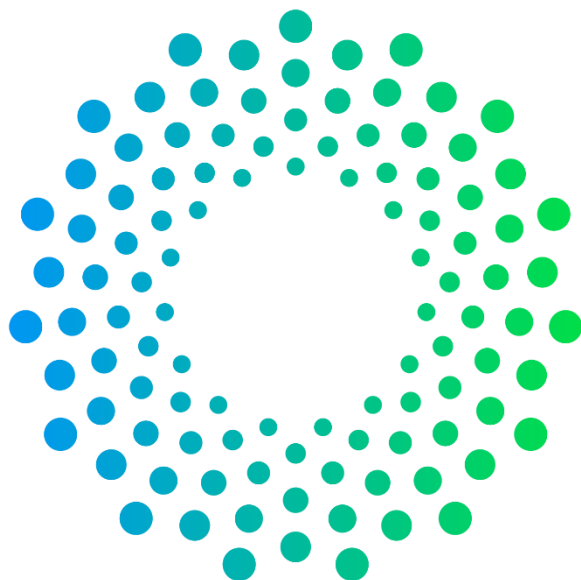

CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

Each zone is responsible for providing uniforms for their respective players. Please contact your zone if you are unsure of the arrangements.

All matches will be played with a white/pink ball.

As per the Cricket Australia policy, helmets are required.

Players are permitted to have their own recovery and compression clothing (skins) in any colour approved by their zone.

Players are expected to take their own cricket equipment i.e., bat, pads, gloves, cricket shoes etc.

Players will require additional clothing for arranged trips and leisure time. Leisure time, however, will be minimal.

PRE-TOUR FITNESS, INJURIES AND HEALTH

Players should prepare themselves appropriately before the championships.

Players **MUST NOT** arrive for the championships already injured and having not communicated that they were injured. Injury can impact negatively on your performance, and it is your responsibility to inform us so appropriate steps can be taken to ensure all players taking part can perform optimally.

It is the responsibility of the players' parents to ensure that they have appropriate medication for their child.

Zone management and coaching staff may not be permitted to give medication to players, whether it be prescription medication or over the counter medication.

INSURANCE

It is also recommended that parents/players understand any policy they may have with regards sport related injuries.

Queensland Cricket has extended the national club risk protection policy via MARSH insurance, however there are several limitations to this policy that parents should be aware of.

NATIONAL CLUB RISK PROTECTION

(Including Personal Injury)

Cricket Australia has a National Club Risk Protection Program with Marsh Insurance which includes personal injury.

Personal Injury Cover provides financial assistance in three key areas:

- Non-Medicare Medical Benefits
- Loss of Income Benefits
- Capital Benefits

Australian Cricket's Commitment to Safeguarding Children and Young People

Delivering a child safe framework across our sport is achieved through supporting Children and Young People, their parents, and guardians and by Australian Cricket and each of our Affiliated Associations and Clubs striving to be a child safe organisation.

Our Commitment to Children and Young People

As part of our commitment to Children and Young People, Australian Cricket and the Affiliated Associations and Clubs seek to:

- a) Provide a safe and supportive environment for Children and Young People.
- b) Ensure that the experiences of Children and Young People are free from any form of Child Abuse, Bullying, Harassment, or other inappropriate conduct such as Grooming.
- c) Empower Children and Young People to act and respond to behaviour that is not acceptable or inappropriate.
- d) Publicise and make available the Codes of Behaviour that underpin our sport.
- e) Make information available on who Children and Young People can approach if they feel unsafe or become aware of or are concerned about any form of Child Abuse, Bullying, Harassment, or other inappropriate conduct such as Grooming.
- f) Establish a reporting framework that allows Children and Young People and others to report any incident affecting the safety and wellbeing of Children and Young People; and
- g) Provide support services to any Child or Young Person and their families who might be affected by any form of Child Abuse, Bullying, Harassment, or other inappropriate conduct such as Grooming whilst participating in our sport.

Australian Cricket recognises the important role that Children and Young People play within our sport and the special care and attention that they need in order to feel safe.

Our Commitment to Parents and Guardians

Australian Cricket and the Affiliated Associations and Clubs are committed to supporting parents and guardians in protecting and safeguarding Children and Young People.

Australian Cricket and the Affiliated Associations and Clubs seek to:

- a) Communicate with parents and guardians of Children and Young People regarding the expectations of our sport in ensuring a safe environment for Children and Young People; and
- b) Publicise and share information with parents and guardians about safeguarding Children and Young People and where they can go to for assistance if they require further information, advice or would like to make a complaint under this Policy.

Our Commitment to Being a Child Safe Organisation

In order to become child safe organisations, Australian Cricket and the Affiliated Associations and Clubs seek to:

- a) Ensure that Australian Cricket Personnel and Players adhere to Australian Cricket's Looking After Our Kids Code of Behaviour for Australian Cricket Personnel.
- b) Ensure that Cricket Participants adhere to Australian Cricket's Looking After Our Kids Code of Behaviour for Affiliated Associations and Clubs.
- c) Use best practice in the recruitment and screening checks for Australian Cricket Personnel and Cricket Participants.
- d) Ensure that Players who will or will likely have contact with Children and Young People undertake screening processes.
- e) Induct Australian Cricket Personnel, Players, and Cricket Participants appropriately for their relevant position, recognising their role in safeguarding Children and Young People and to provide ongoing learning and development opportunities related to child safety.
- f) Take steps to ensure that Australian Cricket Personnel, Players, and Cricket Participants do not engage in Child Abuse, Bullying, Harassment, or other inappropriate conduct such as Grooming or exploit Children or Young People involved in our sport.
- g) Educate Australian Cricket Personnel, Players, and Cricket Participants as to the Codes of Behaviour that underpin our sport.
- h) Ensure that all Australian Cricket Personnel, Players, and Cricket Participants report any concerns, complaints or any allegations of Child Abuse, Bullying, Harassment, or other inappropriate conduct such as Grooming; and
- i) Ensure that all Australian Cricket Personnel, Players, and Cricket Participants are provided with the appropriate support following any incidents or complaints raised under this Policy.

QUEENSLAND COUNTRY TEAMS

Player's Responsibilities

Queensland Country players are subject to the disciplinary jurisdiction of Queensland Cricket.

Queensland Cricket's aim is to encourage players to act in the best interests of Australian cricket at all times & to maintain the highest standards of conduct.

Below are the values that Queensland Country Cricket wants to uphold.

This is our system of operating and is not just a set of rules for the sake of it.

This list of standards and expectations make us a squad that respects one another's' needs & a squad that is proud of the way we conduct ourselves as QCCA players.

- Punctuality
- Team dress/appearance - must be same at all necessary times: pride
- Hard work ethic in training - intensity & honesty
- Re-hydrate, eat & rest properly
- Respect space/needs of teammates: in dressing room, in evenings (roommates)
- Convey key messages to press: "squad above self"
- Team management mobile phone rules must be adhered to
- Communicate problems early - through right channels whether to coach/physio/manager/captain.

Whether cricket or private concerns, voice them early

- Positivity as a team • Attitudes • Actions • Talk
- Queensland Country Team hotel's must be respected.
- Specified 'light's out' times by team management must be adhered to.

- **IF EVER UNSURE ABOUT ANYTHING, ASK FIRST.**



PLAYER'S CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

As a player selected to represent a **North Queensland Cricket Alliance Zone**, you agree to abide by the following requirements in regard to your behaviour and conduct during any training session or competition:

1. Participate within the competition conditions and rules, and in the spirit of fair play and in the spirit of cricket.
2. Behave with dignity and respect at all times.
3. Be a positive role model for QCCA, NQCA and your zone and accept responsibility for your actions.
4. Respect opposition players and officials and treat them with proper regard for their rights, obligations and position held in cricket or the community.
5. Compete in a manner that complies with the umpires' decisions in a dignified and professional manner.
6. Refrain from using abusive, profane, insulting, harassing or otherwise offensive language to members of the public and team members.
7. Maintain high standards of personal hygiene and appearance, including meeting COVID related requirements.
8. Use social media in an appropriate and mature manner.
9. The consumption of illicit drugs whilst on tour is prohibited.

You understand that if your actions contravene any of the requirements outlined above, you may be subject to a sanction applied by the Team Management and/or the NQCA.

COACHES AND MANAGERS (TEAM STAFF) CODE OF CONDUCT

- ◆ Team Staff must respect the rights, dignity and worth of each and every person and treat each equally within the context of the sport
- ◆ Team Staff must place the wellbeing and safety of each player above all other considerations, including the development of performance
- ◆ Team Staff must adhere to all guidelines laid down by NQCA and Queensland Cricket.
- ◆ Team Staff must develop an appropriate working relationship with each player based on mutual trust and respect.
- ◆ Team Staff must not exert undue influence to obtain personal benefit or reward
- ◆ Team Staff must encourage and guide players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour & performance
- ◆ Team Staff must ensure that the activities they direct, or advocate are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience, and ability of players.
- ◆ Team Staff should, at the outset, clarify with the player (and where appropriate, their parents) exactly what is expected of them and also what they are entitled to expect from their coach
- ◆ Team Staff must co-operate fully with other specialists (e.g., other coaches, officials, sports scientists, doctors, physiotherapists) in the best interests of the player.
- ◆ Team Staff must always promote the positive aspects of the game (e.g., fair play) and never condone violations of the Laws of the Game, behaviour contrary to the spirit of the game or the use of prohibited substances or techniques
- ◆ Team Staff must constantly display a high standard of behaviour & appearance
- ◆ Where a breach of this code of conduct is proven Staff may be warned by NQCA or Queensland Cricket. Persistent or serious breach of the above will result in further action being taken.

SPECTATORS CODE OF CONDUCT

The North Queensland Cricket Alliance is committed to providing a safe environment for participation. Aggressive, threatening, or other inappropriate behaviour by members, their families, their friends, and other cricket personnel while attending a game or event will not be tolerated.

These behaviours specifically include:

- using bad language
- harassing or ridiculing players, coaches, officials, or other spectators
- making racist, religious, sexist, or other inappropriate comments to players, coaches, officials, or other spectators
- any threatening behaviour or physical altercation between spectators and players, coaches, officials, or other spectators
- putting undue pressure on children, berating them, or putting down their performance
- being drunk at a championship event.

What we will do

Provide members, their parents and other sporting personnel with our Code of Behaviour and make clear what is expected and the consequences of non-compliance.

Where possible, bind non-members by prominently displaying conditions of entry to grounds and facilities and by requiring parents to abide by club rules.

Reinforce messages of fair and respectful behaviour by displaying signs and posters around our facilities and providing information on our website, in our newsletter and through other club communication.

Encourage NQCA members to complete training to develop their skills and confidence.

Consult with our local police and seek their support and advice on how to handle issues involving inappropriate behaviour by spectators prior to, at or after a game.

Encourage the reporting of incidents and investigate inappropriate behaviours as outlined in this policy and take disciplinary or whatever other actions as are deemed necessary (e.g., appoint a ground official to monitor behaviour).

Encourage our players, coaches, officials, and spectators to call the police if they are concerned about escalating behaviour and their safety or the safety of others.

What we ask you to do

- Help create a positive atmosphere for players, officials, and other spectators by showing respect for players, officials, and other spectators.
- Abide by our club's Code of Behaviour and refrain from using bad language, harassing or ridiculing others or behaving in a threatening or violent manner.
- If you are aware of inappropriate spectator behaviour and you feel confident to do so, speak with the person and ask them to stop. If there is a ground official or committee member present, ask for their assistance.
- Report any inappropriate spectator behaviour to the club president or someone in a position of authority.
- Call the police or a club official if you are concerned about your safety or the safety of others.

Non-Compliance

Parents or others found to have behaved inappropriately, and who are associate members or have agreed to abide by our Code of Behavior and this policy, may face disciplinary action as outlined in our Member Protection Policy.
